### **Property Safety & Standards**

You'll help us keep our accommodation safe, clean, and ready for residents by:

- Completing regular, proactive property checks
- Spotting and reporting repairs or hazards before they escalate
- Supporting void turnarounds so new residents arrive to a welcoming home
- Monitoring fire safety equipment and communal areas
- Carrying out basic compliance tasks such as water flushing and alarm tests

### **Resident Support & Wellbeing**

You'll often be a steady, reassuring presence — especially during evenings, weekends, and nights.

This includes:

- Responding calmly to concerns or noise issues
- Offering trauma-informed support and clear guidance
- Helping residents understand expectations and how to report issues
- Working alongside support colleagues to promote a respectful, inclusive atmosphere

## **Safety, Risk & Incident Response**

You'll support the service to stay safe and compliant by:

- Responding appropriately to incidents or emergencies
- Feeding into risk assessments and safety plans
- Recording incidents clearly and accurately
- Escalating safeguarding concerns promptly

## **Teamwork & Communication**

You'll collaborate with different colleagues and partners by:

- Working closely with the Voids & Facilities Manager
- Sharing updates at handovers and across shifts
- Joining team meetings and reflective sessions
- Building positive relationships with contractors and cleaners

- Occasional night shifts
- Travel between accommodation sites
- Providing flexible cover when needed
